

# THE JUNK CAR PROCESS

## 1) TAKE INVENTORY

Write down the parts that you think are good on your vehicle, such as tires, interior, windows, headlights, etc. This way when you call Junk Cars For Cash, you can give us a more detailed overview of your car.

## 2) KNOW THE VALUE

Ask an expert to inspect your car and tell you its value. Make sure to get an estimated price from multiple sources so you have an accurate price range to work with. This will help you gauge whether a junk car company is trying to rip you off or not.

## 4) REMOVE ALL PERSONAL ITEMS

Some things are easy to overlook, like a pair of sunglasses above your gear shifter or a CD in the CD player. Be sure to go over your car 2 or 3 times and don't leave anything behind. Especially don't forget your license plates.

## 5) KNOW THE LAW

Be sure to know the Missouri law about relinquishing your junk car for money before you decide to do it. There are a ton of scam companies out there who will try to purchase your car and use it for illegal practices.

## 6) CONTACT A JUNK CAR COMPANY

Once you find a trusted company, you'll want to call for a quote and set up a time for them to come to pick up your car. Always look for a company that has an actual business name, a brick and mortar location, has authentic customer reviews, and always pays in cash.

## 7) ASK LOTS OF QUESTIONS

While you're on the phone you can ask as many questions as you'd like. In fact, the more the better. The most important questions are "Do you require a car title?", "Do you provide towing or will I need to move my own car?", "Do you pay cash?" and "Are you licensed?".

## 8) SHOP AROUND

You should never settle for less than what your car is worth. You'll also want to be wary of companies that offer you extremely high values. No matter how much cash they offer you, you'll always want to do research on them to make sure they're legitimate.

## 9) MOVE YOUR CAR

Some companies will offer towing services while others will require you to move your car yourself. If the car isn't drivable and the company doesn't offer a towing service, you'll have to find a company on your own for an extra expense.

## 10) RELINQUISH YOUR PLATES

When you have your cash in hand and have signed the appropriate paperwork, you'll need to go to the DMV to relinquish your plates and make sure your registration is canceled.
